




• Our membership has interests in medical materials science, biosensors, biomechanics, biocompatibility, tissue engineering, and many other subjects.




## **United Kingdom Society for Biomaterials**

- Each year we host our annual conference at different locations throughout the UK.
- The event is typically 2-3 days long, hosting presentations from academics, PDRAs, PhD MSc students, industry representatives and clinicians.

- Next year's conference is scheduled for the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> July at Keele University.




## Prizes

- **UKSB Travel Bursaries** for UKSB who wish to attend and present at the UKSB annual conference (registration and up to £300).
- **ESB Travel Bursaries** for UKSB PhD student members to attend and present at the ESB annual conference (up to £300).
- Lab-to-Lab Award: This award is open to all UKSB members and will provide up to £1000 per award to facilitate interactions between 2 or more labs and the development of new collaborations. Applicants from all labs (1 per lab) must be UKSB members.



## **Prizes**

- **Postgraduate Prizes** are awarded to the best presentations at the annual conference.
- The President's Prize aims to recognise outstanding contributions during a lifetime career to the UK Biomaterials field
- Alan Wilson Memorial Lecture Award celebrates the life and career of the outstanding dental materials scientist Dr Alan Wilson OBE (1928-2011), we are awarding this prize to recognise the work and contribution of the awardee, who will be an individual scientist who has contributed significantly to the field of biomaterials science in dentistry (including maxillo-facial repair).
- Larry Hench Young Investigators Prize is a £500 prize to a promising young research scientist in recognition of outstanding and innovative contributions in a selected field of biomaterials research, and in remembrance of such a key figure of this field- Prof Larry Hench (1938-2015).




## Membership

- Academics, clinicians and the biomaterials industry are encouraged to join and help to develop the subject of biomaterials in the UK.




## Membership


### Membership fees
